

Goat Vet Kit Checklist

- Rectal Thermometer
- Weight Tape
- Stethoscope
- Nipples/Bottle (feeding/supplementing newborns)
- Iodine (dipping navels and hooves of newborns, first aid)
- OB snare (distocia)
- OB Lube
- Alcohol (first aid)
- Powdered Colostrum (newborns need to ingest within two hours after birth)
- Rubber Tube (tube feeding weak kids)
- Drenching gun (drench mature animals)
- Dexamethasone (Premature kids, anti-inflammatory, brain swelling, induces labor, supportive therapy)
- Ketone Strips (helps diagnosis ketosis)
- Propylene Glycol (helps treat pregnancy toxemia/ketosis)

- Calcium Gluconate/CMPK/MFO (treats milk fever)
- Banamine (pain and fever reducer)
- Fortified B Complex (vitamin deficiency, stress, boosts appetite, anemia treatment)
- Vitamin B1/Thiamine (treats polio/listeriosis)
- CD Antitoxin (floppy kid syndrome, enterotoxemia, toxicity, useful anytime there's a rumen imbalance)
- Probiotics (after antibiotics or rumen upsets)
- Antibiotic Ointment/Vetrycin (minor wounds)
- Bandages/Gauze/Vet Wrap
- 18 & 20 gauge needles, ½ and 1 in long
- Syringes, 3 & 6 cc
- BO-SE (treats white muscle disease, weak kids, selenium deficiency)
- Exam Gloves/OB sleeves
- Electrolytes
- Activated Charcoal (poisonings/toxicities)

- Dewormer (internal and external parasite treatments)
- Blood Stop Powder
- Milk of Magnesia (helps treat poisonings, compromised rumens, floppy kid syndrome)
- Ammonium Chloride (treats urinary calculi)
- Antibiotics (treats various infections)
- Antibiotic Eye Ointment (treats pinkeye)
- Kaopectate (treats diarrhea)
- Baking Soda/Bloat Release
- Iron Supplement/Red Cell (treats anemia)
- Lactated Ringers (dehydration)
- DOSAGE CHARTS/BINDER (containing useful treatment guides, dosage information, normal temperatures, and other helpful emergency information)
